Political Bacground

- A Socialist, non-aligned country
- Between East and West
- The Constitutional changes and developments:
- The Birth of formal Federal State with Constitution of 1945
- Constitution of 1953
- Constitution of 1963
- Federal System of 1974 Constitution



- Treaty of Rome, 1957/58
- Schengen Treaty, 1985
- Single European Act, 1986/87
- Maastricht Treaty, 1992/93



Forming of connections of E.E.C. and Yugoslavia

- Yugoslavia joined to the GATT, 1965
- Reception of guest workers from Yugoslavia, 1968
- Trade agreement between Yugoslavia and E.E.C. 1970 for three years
- A five year framework agreement, 1973
- Regular ministerial level relations from 1974
- The first comprihensive bilateral agreement between E.E.C. and Yugoslavia, 1976
- Croatia and Slovenia founding members of Alpine-Adriatic Working Community, 1978
- Death of Mr. Tito, 1980



Economic and political connections between E.C. and Yugoslavia after 1980

- The Christian Science Monitor discussion: "A Communist country joining the capitalist Common Market?"



- End of "Yugoslav" ideology
- Collapse of Social structure
- Collapse of Communist Party
- Collapse of Army
- Collapse of federal systems



- Prime Minister of Yugoslavia, Ante Markovic, 1990:
- Achievement of full E.C. membership is a priority goal for the country
- Save Yugoslavia from disintegration (to keep Yugoslavia together in the framework of E.C.) and civil war
