- Region along the Hungarian–Croatian– Slovenian border
- 13 Croatian and 2
 Slovenian county



Short History of Financial Services

- 1990's post-soviet transition and independence in these countries
- Necessity of reforms in this years
 - unregulated and inadequately controlled business environment of the financial institutions;
 - the low reputation of financial institutions rendered it more difficult to attract deposits and increase their portfolio or clientele;
 - bad debt inherited from large companies.

After the Banking Reforms

Croatia

- Adaptation of market conditions and international standards
- Government bonds release in foreign countries

Slovenia

- The most rapid bank reform in post-Yogoslavian countries
- Full guarantee of the frozen assets
- Nationalization of largest banks

South Pannonia

- Centralized bank system in assets
- But:
 - Decentralized bank branch network with non-central headquarters (special geograpical form of countries)
 - Bank HQs in South-Pannonia:
 - HR: 22 (total 32); SLO: 4 (total 22)

Insurance companies in Croatia

- All Croatian insurance companies' HQs are in Zagreb
- Size of insurance sector
 - 218 branches
 - Life insurance: 155,5 M€
 - Non-life insurance: 496,5 M€



Insurance companies in Slovenia

- 2 insurance companies in South Pannonia Region (total 21)
- The Maribor Insurance Company 3rd largest in the life insurance sector, and 4th largest in the non-life sector
- Market share of Maribor Insurance Company is 12,84%

 South Pannonia is a region with 13 central Croatian counties and 2 peripheral Slovenian counties
